The Southeastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority's (SEPTA) Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program, a component of its existing DBE Program, was developed in accordance with Title 49 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Part 26.39 – Fostering Small Business Participation. The basis for SBE verification is economic disadvantage and applies the same size limits (e.g., gross receipts and personal net worth) as DBE certification.

As an existing firm currently DBE-certified with SEPTA, you are automatically included in the SBE Program. However, your firm must maintain its DBE certification status to continue participation in the SBE Program. In the event of a change in circumstances that may affect your DBE, and consequently your SBE status, you must inform the DBE Program Office immediately, describing in detail the nature of such changes. We reserve the right to review your firm at any time to ensure compliance with the program.
